FROM THE MANAGEMENT

CARDBOARD RECYCLING BIN: The blue bin is working well in getting rid of all those packing boxes from recent move-ins and most residents are doing the right thing. Please remember it is only for cardboard boxes of every size. These must be flattened and, where possible, they should be stacked standing up around the inside walls of the bins. Currently the bin is collected fortnightly and will remain so until all residents have moved in, when it is anticipated there will be more room available between collections.

TOUR AND SPECIAL EVENTS SIGN-UP LISTS: Following several recent requests, the lists had been relocated to the Lounge. However, as a result of feedback, these lists have now been relocated back to the Library noticeboard.

SUMMER IS UPON US so it's a good time to clean out the cobwebs and hornet nests that might be on your balcony. For those units that have shutters installed we suggest that a vacuum and spray of WD40 on the tracks will keep the shutters moving along smoothly. If you're keen, wipe the blades clean of dust and build up.

SOME RESIDENTS may have noticed that the grout in your balcony tiles looks powdery. This is **efflorescence** and is **common in tile, stone, concrete, brick and grout**. In many cases, **efflorescence will disappear on its own over time.** However, if you wish to reduce the appearance of efflorescence, brushing with a small nylon brush will remove the powder. This can then be vacuumed up. **Handy hint**. Do not use an excessive amount of water when mopping your balconies as this only encourages further efflorescence to occur.

SECURITY ALERT!! All residents please note that you must not let anyone into the building unless you know who they are. We have had a couple of incidents recently where residents have allowed people unknown to them into the building. Unless you know who they are, those who are visiting residents must contact them to gain access. Other visitors should contact Karen. **WE ARE A SECURE BUILDING AND NEED TO MAINTAIN STRICT SECURITY.**

Great news that the last unit has been sold!! That means that the display furniture from those units is being dismantled. Some of the items have already been returned to BHC and others sold. However, there are still a number of items remaining and an in-house minigarage sale is planned for next month. Funds raised will go towards future improvements to the Village to the benefit of all residents. The items for sale will include a bed, bedroom tables, lamps and assorted decor items. 
